Education Evaluation Work Group Overview

This work group will look at evaluation data from individual programming and make recommendations for future course revisions. They will also evaluate the COT education portfolio as a whole and identify areas of need. Using evaluation and quality data, they will recommend topics for shorter, less intensive educational offerings.

Education Evaluation Work Group Deliverable(s)

- Identify data points to evaluate trauma education programs
- Organize, review, and analyze evaluation data from current COT educational programming
- Provide evaluation outcomes and recommendations to Course Chairs on potential program enhancements
- Review the COT Education portfolio to determine gaps in knowledge, skills, and or abilities
- Utilize findings (to identify additional opportunities and innovative formats for educational programming. E.g. one-hour online synchronous sessions, podcasts, journal clubs, microlearning, etc.
- Participate in an ACS COT Trauma Education needs assessment

Membership will include individuals who represent the makeup of the COT Education target audience (e.g., trauma surgeons, ER physicians, family practice physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, other advanced practice providers, medical educators, etc.)
