## Spotlight Discussions | Saturday, October 19, 2024, 10:45-11:45 AM

### Spotlight Discussion 1

***"I am from the US Government. I need your trauma beds." Awareness and Action to Assist the USG NDMS Pilot Study***

**Location: General Session Room - Grand Ballroom A, Grand Ballroom Level, Tower 2**

**Description:** The National Center for Disaster Medicine and Public Health (NCDMPH) leads the congressionally directed DoD National Disaster Medical System (NDMS) Pilot Program. The goal of this program is to assess and strengthen the NDMS to meet the needs of US casualties returning home from a large-scale war. The effort is being piloted at five sites strategically located throughout the country (Washington, D.C.; San Antonio, TX; Denver, CO; Omaha, NE; and Sacramento, CA). To foster and support cross-site collaboration, the pilot established a consortium with representatives from the five pilot sites as well as federal and interagency partners, and now the ACS-COT.

### Spotlight Discussion 2

***Help Shape EMS Education for the Next Generation of Trauma Surgeons***

**Description:** The EMS workgroup of the COT has begun an extensive project in conjunction with the AAST Acute Care Surgery Committee to begin education of Acute Care Surgery Fellows on EMS. Currently there is a significant gap in the awareness of fellows in prehospital care. In this session, we will discuss the current gaps in education and strategies to fill them including didactic education, rotations, and even fellowship tracks.

### Spotlight Discussion 3

***Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, and Big Data***

**Description:** The goal of the session is to define the issues and nomenclature of artificial intelligence, machine learning, and big data germane to trauma and acute care surgery and to provide a framework for COT leadership and guidance on issues of AI, ML and Big Data in trauma and surgery.

### Spotlight Discussion 4

***Growing the Umbrella and Breaking Down Silos: Improving the Engagement and Collaboration of the Specialty Groups in the Care of Trauma Patient***

**Description:** While specialty surgeons are involved in the central COT, it is unclear if workgroup participation, new member recruitment, and general information exchange can be further optimized to take advantage of this rich source of experience and knowledge. The goal of this session is to discuss the barriers and facilitators to improving not only specialty involvement in the COT, but also mechanisms to break down silos between groups to enhance the complete care of the trauma patient.

### Spotlight Discussion 5

***Burn and Large Wound Management in Acute Care Surgery: Daily Care and Disaster Preparedness***

**Description:** This discussion will center on the critical role of wound care within the acute care surgeon's practice. Previous sessions have explored ways to enhance burn and wound education during the training pipeline. In this session, our focus will shift to identifying the knowledge and experience gaps among practicing surgeons. By understanding the challenges these surgeons encounter, we can discuss targeted training and education opportunities, including just-in-time resources, to address these gaps. Finally, we will explore how the Committee on Trauma (COT) can collaborate with

organizations such as the American Burn Association (ABA) and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST) to ensure that surgeons maintain essential skills and knowledge as part of overall disaster preparedness.

### Spotlight Discussion 1

#### Preventing Trauma Center Overload and Managing Limited Resources: The Pros and Cons of Empowering Referring Hospitals to Reduce Avoidable Transfers

**Description:** Almost 40% of transfers to Level I trauma centers are discharged within 48 hours without any interventions. Currently, most Level I centers are over capacity, so these transfers cause significant inefficiencies. Further, patients are often transported over long distances and can be challenged to get back home. Considering the ideals of an inclusive trauma system, should we be thinking about how trauma centers can facilitate more appropriate resource matching by supporting their local hospitals in caring for minimally injured patients?

### Spotlight Discussion 2

#### This is How We Did It - State Trauma System Development

#### Empowering Resilience: Collaborative Strategies for Trauma Education in Under-Resourced Environments

**Description:** There is a need for an organized and proactive plan for introduction and dissemination of trauma education in under-resourced environments. This effort will require a collaborative approach to include potential funding partners with the goal of education that is provided at no cost to the individual learner.

#### Stop the Bleed Pediatrics

**Description:** As the Stop the Bleed Version 3 is now completed, with the overwhelming success of the adult training curriculum, we have recognized the potential need for a pediatric course. This is a gap that has been identified by our students, instructors and both the media and public. There are courses being taught to this learner group at this time, which were not developed by the ACS COT, and there are challenges when moving forward. This includes a wide range of educational design issues ranging from the physical ability to participate in technical skills through to the psychological impact of doing so and the important aspects of age specific content development.

### Spotlight Discussion 5

#### Adolescent Trauma Care - Engaging Adult Trauma Centers to Provide Optimal Care

**Description:** The goal of this session is to share ideas on how adult trauma centers (ATC) can focus on adolescent trauma care by optimizing ATC resources required to care for severely injured children and enable ATC and trauma surgeons across the country to feel empowered to provide quality care to children similar to adults and geriatric patients as there are limited number of pediatric trauma centers in parts of the United States.
